ly funny account of what has happened to this country has left me dizzy."

for the Monday August 13, 2018 meeting of the City of Lawrence Public Incentive Review Committee (PIRC)

- 1. Administration and Procedures
 - a. The minutes of the April 23, 2018, meeting were approved
 - b. A quorum was present to conduct business.
- 2. Discuss of application by Heritage Tractor for Industrial Revenue Bonds (IRB) financing to obtain sales tax exemption on construction materials to rebuild facility at 1110 E. 23rd St. that was destroyed by fire.
 - a. Heritage Tractor has distributed John Deere agricultural equipment at its Lawrence location since 2009. Large equipment is 65-70 % of annual sales.
 - b. The hub of the company is located in Baldwin City.
 - c. The Lawrence market is in about a 60-mile radius.
 - d. On May 5, 2018, the facility on 23rd Street was destroyed by fire ignited by a falling utility pole. The Westar insurance company will reimburse about 1/3 to ½ of the replacement cost.
 - e. A 22,000 sq ft building will be constructed on 3.5 acres to replace the 14,000 sq ft. building that was destroyed.
 - f. The existing employment is 28 employees averaging \$50,000 per year in salary. Employment is expected to increase by 5-10 jobs over the next few years.
 - g. The company is requesting \$3,000,000 in IRB's for project costs. About \$1,500,000 of that amount is for materials subject to sales tax. About \$163,500 in sales tax will be exempt. The City of Lawrence has no liability under the IRB issue.

3. Other discussion points

a. Erik Kirkendall asked whether or not Heritage Tractor was being given an unfair advantage against their competitor, Kubota, across the street. The consensus was that because Her-

- itage Tractor was being made whole from the fire there wasn't an unfair advantage. Such advantage could accrue if a new company from outside the City was provided a similar financing package.
- b. Asst. City Mgr. Diane Stoddard said the City recommends approval of the IRB financing and sales tax exemption for construction materials.

4. Decision

a. PIRC members unanimously approved the motion for the application by Heritage Tractor for IRB's, and the concurrent sales tax exemption on construction materials.

VOTER SERVICE: The Voter Services Committee held 12 voter registration events from June 30th through July 19th. The largest event was the Naturalization Ceremony at the Lied Center. We registered 204 new citizens to vote out of the 327 people who were naturalized during this ceremony. Lois Orth-Lopes lead a team of volunteers who distributed Voter Reg-

istration Applications throughout the Lied Center Auditorium prior to the 10 a.m. ceremony. After the ceremony, the new citizens returned their forms to the waiting volunteers

who checked the forms for completeness. Due to the court ruling in June, we did not have to photocopy the naturalization documents saving time for the new citizens and the volunteers.
